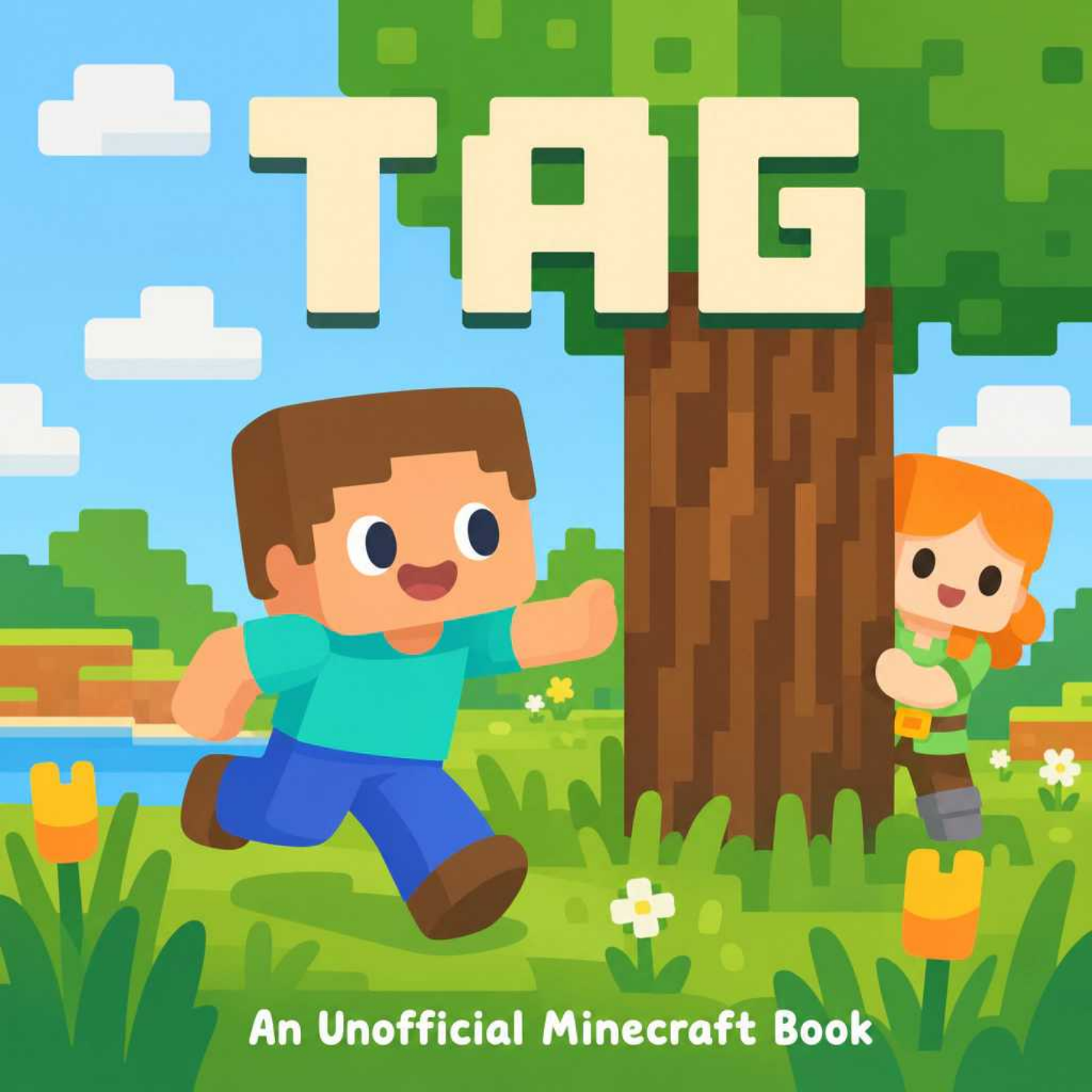


TAG



An Unofficial Minecraft Book

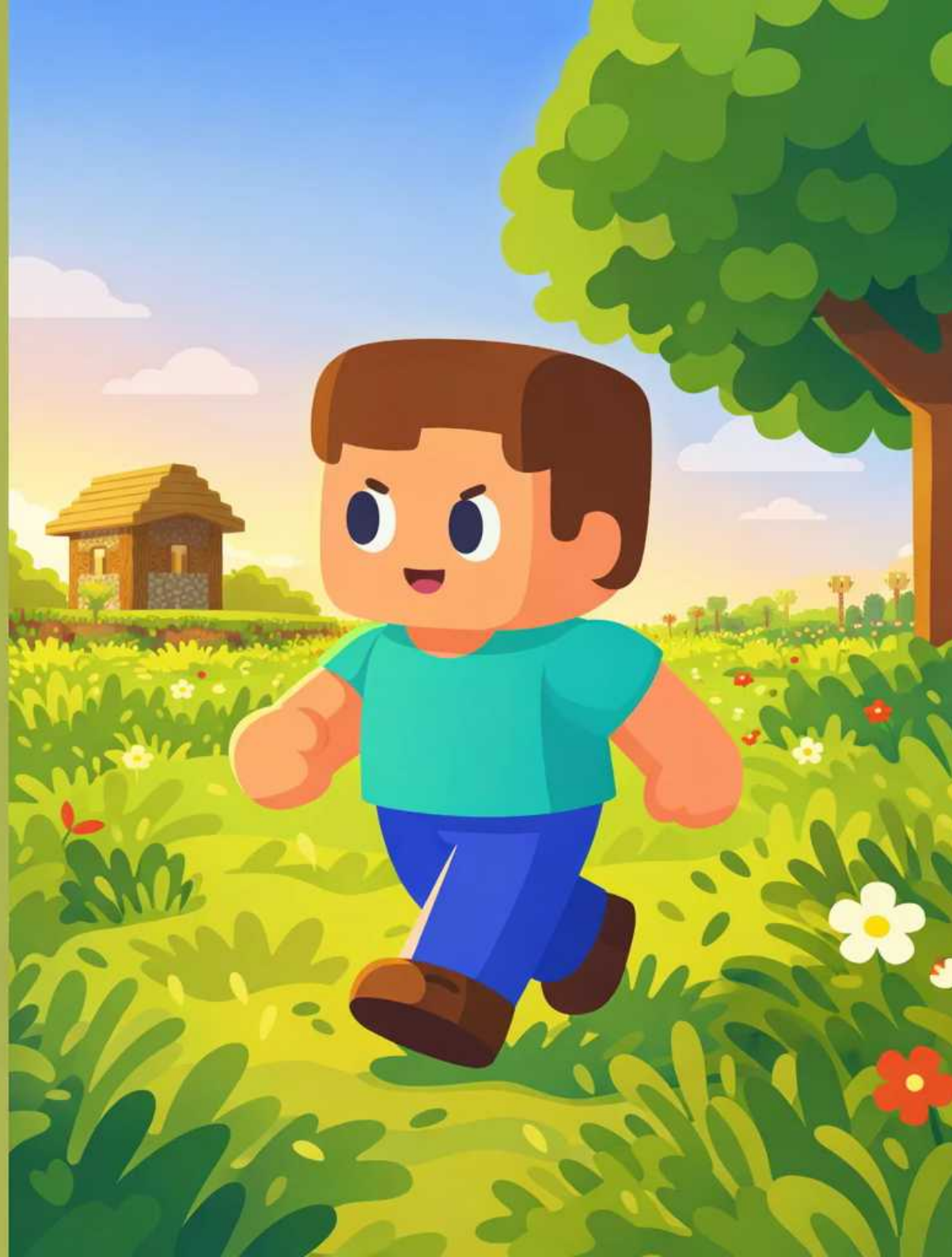
Steve looks out,

small!

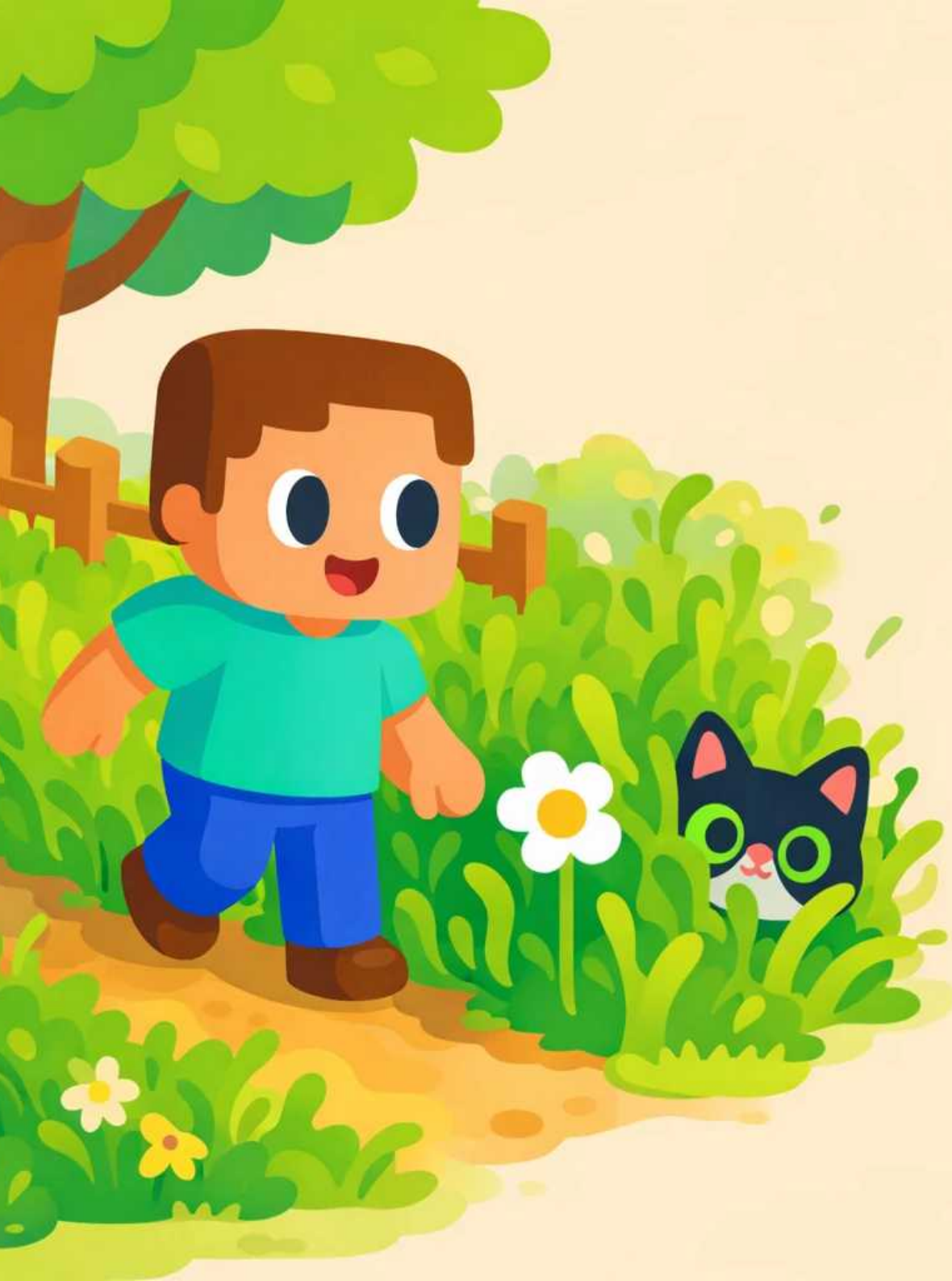




A twig snaps

tree?

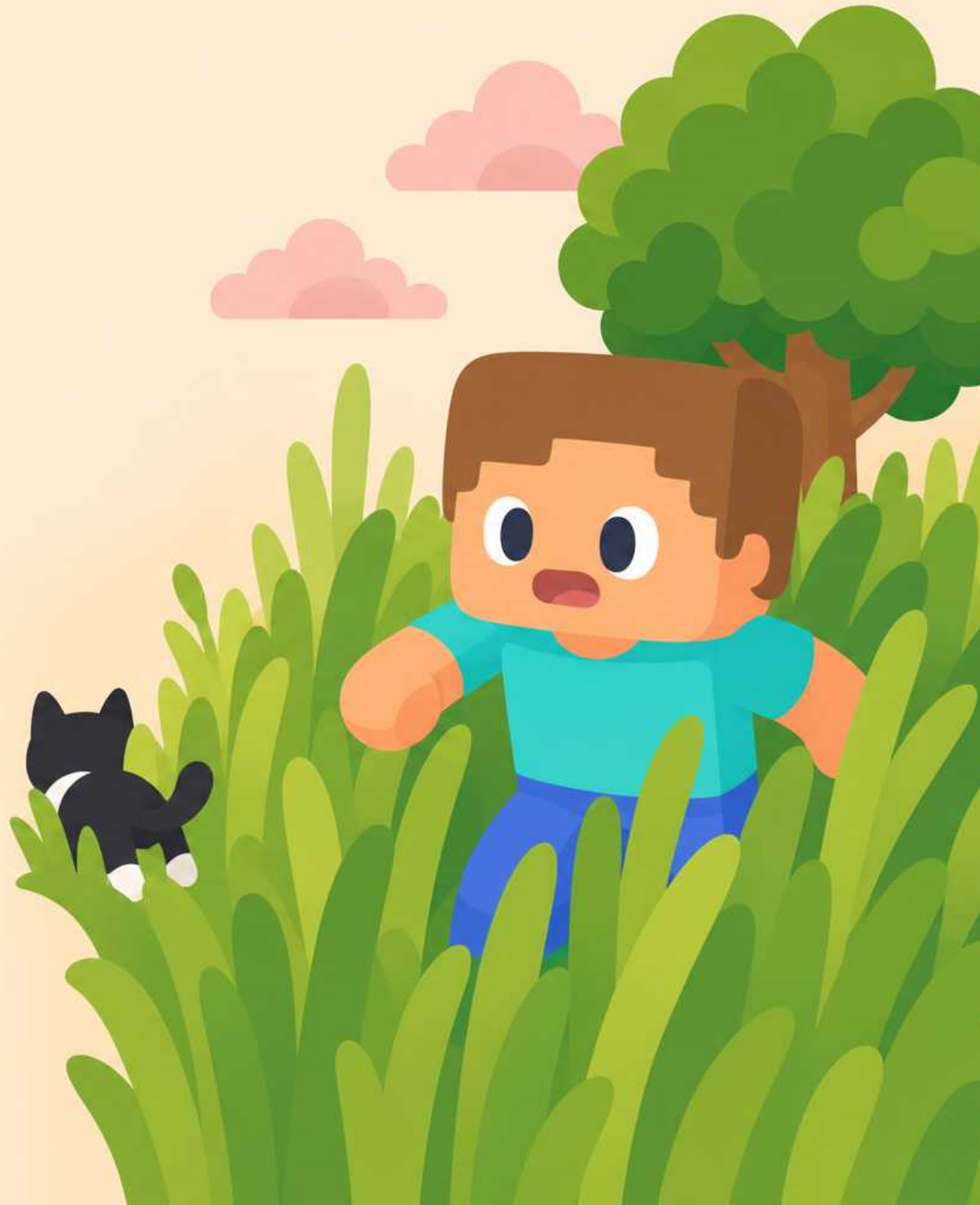
Just a white

tall grass now.

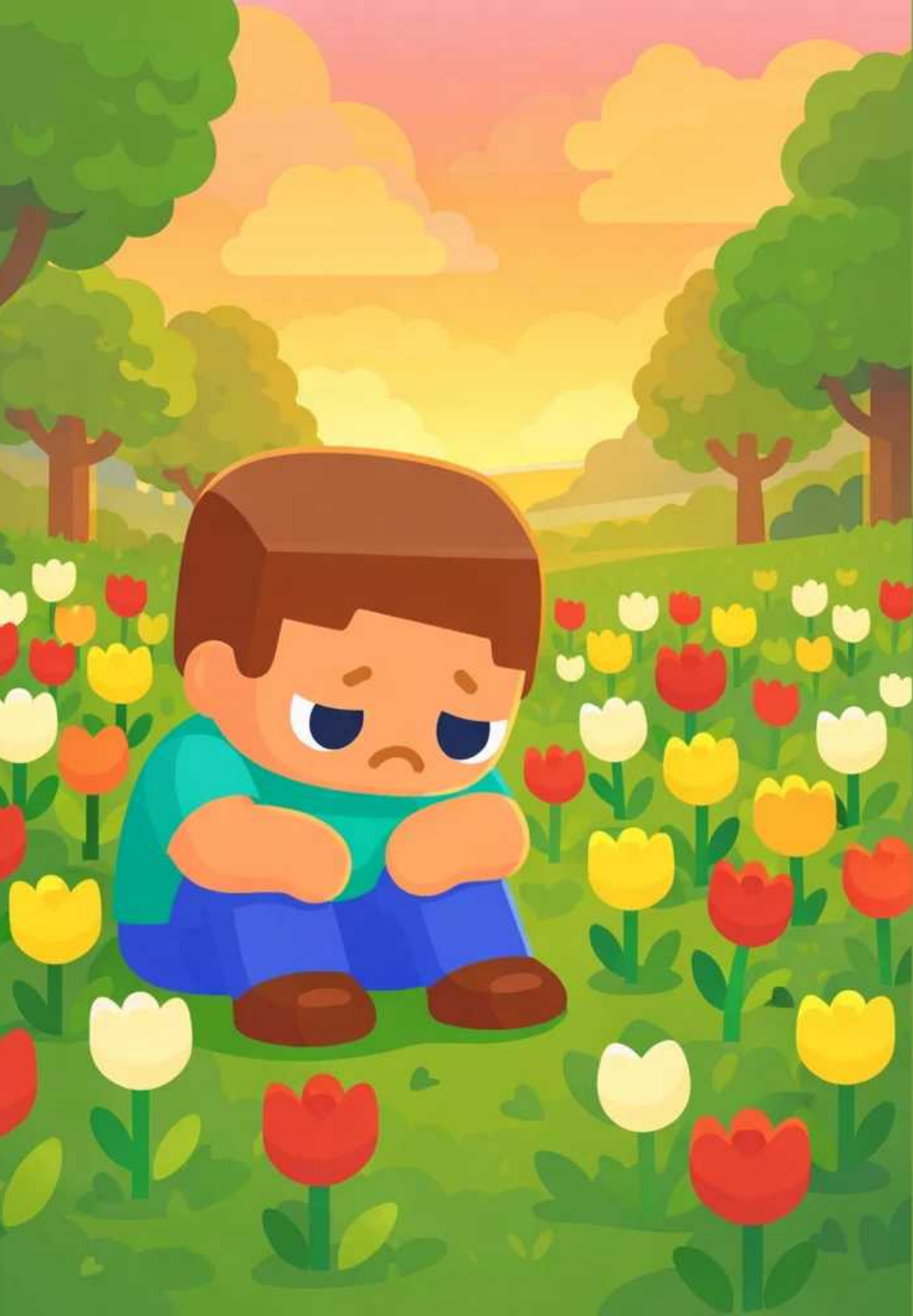




Steve sees a
